Creative Curriculum Year 3 Term 1 Stone Age to Iron Age



Children will learn of the different Stone Age periods (Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic) and how and why the Bronze Age and Iron Age followed. They will compare life before and after farming and will learn about how the lifestyle and dwellings changed through the different ages. They will learn of the similarities and differences and how humans went from a nomadic lifestyle to living in settlements and hillforts.
